

Sydney Metro is Australia’s largest public transport project. It will transform Sydney, delivering more trains and faster services for customers across the network.

Sydney Metro City & Southwest extends the new metro network from the end of the Sydney Metro Northwest at Chatswood, under Sydney Harbour, through new railway stations in the CBD and west to Bankstown – a total of 66 kilometres of metro rail.

When services start in 2024, there will be a train at least every four minutes in the peak – customers won’t need a timetable, they’ll just turn up and go.

The \$2.81 billion contract for tunnelling and station excavation works was awarded to John Holland CPB Ghella Joint Venture on 22 June 2017.

Early works – Waterloo Station site

Early works will continue at the Waterloo Station site during the month of **September 2017**. The following activities will be undertaken, weather and site conditions permitting (see map overleaf).

Waterloo Station site	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Eight large vehicle deliveries will occur this month between Monday 11 September and Saturday 30 September, 2017. Due to the size of the vehicles, they are only permitted to travel on the road between 7pm and 7am. Protection and relocation of underground services.
Botany Road, Cope Street, Raglan Street and Wellington Street	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Protection and relocation of underground and aboveground services including trenching, installing new power poles, bundling and protecting overhead cables Temporary lane and footpath closures around the site.
What to expect	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> There will be intermittent periods of noisy works. The project team will limit these impacts wherever possible by reducing the number of machines operating at the same time and turning off equipment when not in use. Non-tonal reversing beepers will be used and workers will be instructed to keep noise to a minimum. Increased light vehicle and large vehicle movements via the site access on Botany Road. Temporary traffic and pedestrian changes will be required including lane and footpath closures around the site. Traffic control and directional signage will be in place for the safety of workers and the community. Access to properties will be maintained at all times. 	

Work hours

Standard work hours for the Waterloo Station site are **Monday to Friday between 7am and 6pm and Saturday between 8am and 1pm**. If work is required outside of these hours local residents and businesses will be notified in advance.
