

## Monthly update - Waterloo

October 2017

Sydney Metro is Australia's largest public transport project. It will transform Sydney, delivering more trains and faster services for customers across the network.

Sydney Metro City & Southwest extends the new metro network from the end of the Sydney Metro Northwest at Chatswood, under Sydney Harbour, through new railway stations in the CBD and west to Bankstown – a total of 66 kilometres of metro rail.

When services start in 2024, there will be a train at least every four minutes in the peak – customers won't need a timetable, they'll just turn up and go.

The \$2.81 billion contract for tunnelling and station excavation works was awarded to John Holland CPB Ghella Joint Venture on 22 June 2017.

### Early works – Waterloo Station site


Standard construction hours are **Monday to Friday between 7am and 6pm and Saturday between 8am and 1pm**. Due to high daytime traffic volumes and to ensure pedestrian safety, some works are also planned for outside of these times.

Within and around the site	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Continuing removal of internal walls and demolishing external walls and roofing</li> <li>Installing hoarding and scaffolding around the site</li> <li>Tree trimming along the boundary to install hoarding and scaffolding</li> </ul>
Raglan, Cope and Wellington streets	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Investigations to locate underground utilities by excavating narrow trenches called a slit trenching</li> </ul>
Botany Road, Cope, Raglan and Wellington streets	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Investigations to locate underground utilities using hand held equipment and opening lids to underground pits</li> </ul>
Location	Out-of-hours works
	The following works will occur on <b>Monday to Friday between 7pm and 7am throughout October</b> .
Within and around the site	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Delivery of plant and equipment using large vehicles and installing hoarding and scaffolding around the site <b>over 15 nights</b>.</li> </ul>
Botany Road, Cope, Raglan and Wellington streets	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Utility and geotechnical investigations, protection, relocation of services involving trenching, overhead cable bunding and installation of new power poles will take place on approximately <b>10 nights over a two week period</b>, involving surveys and pit openings and require the use of a vaccum truck</li> </ul>

### What to expect

- There will be intermittent periods of noisy works. The project team will limit these impacts wherever possible by reducing the number of machines operating at the same time and turning off equipment when not in use.
- Non-tonal reversing beepers will be used and workers will be instructed to keep noise to a minimum.
- Increased light vehicle and large vehicle movements via the site access on Botany Road.
- Temporary traffic and pedestrian changes will be required including lane and footpath closures around the site. Traffic control and directional signage will be in place for the safety of workers and the community.
- Access to properties will be maintained at all times.
