

MONTHLY UPDATE – WATERLOO

Sydney Metro is Australia's biggest public transport project.

Services start in 2019 in the city's North West with a train every four minutes in the peak. Metro rail will be extended into the CBD and beyond to Bankstown in 2024. Sydney Metro includes new CBD railway stations underground at Martin Place, Pitt Street and Barangaroo and new metro platforms under Central.

In 2024, Sydney Metro will have 31 stations on a new 66km rail system – the biggest urban rail project in Australian history. Sydney Metro will have ultimate capacity for a train every two minutes in each direction under the CBD.

John Holland CPB Ghella Joint Venture (JHCPBG) has been awarded the \$2.81 billion contract to build the twin railway tunnels from Chatswood to Sydenham and excavate six new Sydney Metro stations.

Station excavation works - Waterloo Station site

Demolition activities are expected to be completed in early February 2018. Site activities this month will concentrate on preparing the site for station excavation works, which includes the delivery of large equipment such as mobile cranes and piling rigs.

Standard construction hours are **Monday to Friday between 7am and 6pm and Saturday between 8am and 1pm**. Due to high daytime traffic volumes and to ensure pedestrian safety, some works are also planned for outside of these times.

What to expect

- Temporary traffic and pedestrian changes will be required including lane and footpath closures around the site. Traffic control and directional signage will be in place for the safety of workers and the community.
- There will be intermittent periods of noisy works during day and out-of-hour works. Out-of-hours works will
 involve the use of drilling equipment, vacuum excavation trucks, excavators, a rock breaker and a concrete
 saw.
- Non-tonal reversing beepers will be used and workers will be instructed to keep noise to a minimum.
- Increased large vehicle movements via the site access on Botany Road.
