1 Working Together

- 1.1 "Engage stakeholders and develop clear community governance arrangements which support and enable collaboration between a wide range of organisations.".
- 1.2 <u>Monitor and strengthen Waterloo community approach activities that allow comprehensive community input aligned with community need.</u>
- 1.3 Meaningfully engage tenants and community members inon the design of community spaces.
- 1.34 Develop and deliver meaningful and well resourced tenant participation structures and programs.
- 1.45 Develop a precinct governance structure to lead the long term management and maintenance of Waterloo South.
- 1.5 Report back to the 6 Collaborate with community on progress against people and place actions ongoing recommendations for Waterloo South.

2 Working with Social Housing tenants

- 2.1 Co-design communications 2.1 Maintain and enhance current collaborative communication strategies to support tenants across Waterloo with a wide variety of backgrounds and needs, including Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people, CALD communities and people living with disability.
- 2.2 Maintain Waterloo Connect as a central location for tenant communications and outreach.
- 2.3 Provide each tenant with a dedicated, experienced and trained Relocation Officer to work with them and coordinate their move and support.
- 2.4 Ensure the Relocations Team relocation team includes specialised support coordinators specialists

to-undertake-case-management-and-work-closely-with-tenants-needing-complex-referrals.

- 2.5 Provide specialist services to support tenants with specific needs during relocations, including decluttering and specialist cleaning.
- 2.6 Appoint an independent tenant advocate who understands the housing system and is available to support tenants and advocate for their rights and interests.
- 2.7 "Give all existing social housing tenants the right to return to Waterloo if they choose."
- 2.8 Ensure Deliver at least 30% of all new housing in Waterloo South isas social housing.
- 2.9 Ensure at least "Deliver up to 20% of all new housing in Waterloo South is as affordable housing."
- 2.10 Explore innovative housing models that meet a wide range of housing needs.
- 2.11 Design and deliver all new housing to be tenure blind, without obvious differences between tenure types.
- 2.12 Prepare and implement a local strategy for allocating social and affordable housing to new tenants, including priority groups such as Aboriginal people._
- 2.13 Maintain an on-site office for social and affordable housing tenants to access housing and support coordination services.
- 2.14 Coordinate long term wrap around support for social and affordable housing tenants.
- 2.15 Maintain social and affordable housing properties to a high standard.

3 Working with the Aboriginal Community

- 3.1 Engage with diverse Aboriginal voices- and support the self-determination and empowerment of the local Aboriginal community.
- 3.2 "Ensure there is ongoing collaboration and co-design with the local First Nations community, including for the operation of the area."
- 3.3 Make meaningful effort to restore the Country that existed as Illpah, before Waterloo was formed, including waterways, flora and fauna.
- 3.4 Make Country visible in the design of buildings and public spaces, through colour, texture, form, landscape and naming.
- 3.5 Ensure the modern stories of Waterloo and Redfern are given strong visibility throughout the development, especially 1920-1980s.
- 3.6 Provide dedicated time and spaces for to celebrate Aboriginal culture, ceremony and cultureheritage, including smoking ceremonies, celebrations, dance and for grieving.
- 3.7 <u>Make at At</u> least <u>1520</u>% of <u>new</u> social <u>and affordable</u> housing <u>and 15% of new affordable housing</u> <u>at Waterloo South managed by an Aboriginal CHP and</u> available to First Nations tenants.
- 3.8 Ensure an Aboriginal CHP manages the social and affordable housing available to First Nations tenants.

4 Supporting health and wellbeing

- 4.1 Deliver a community hub with a mix of active and passive spaces for communal use, community gatherings and connection, as well as service delivery.
- 4.2 <u>Build at Make better use of existing community infrastructure and its availability and use for community outcomes.</u>
- 4.3 Develop strategies to reduce social isolation and loneliness and enhance the use of social prescriptions.
- 4.4 At least 15% of apartments in eachall new building to social housing at Waterloo South built to Gold standard accessibility under the Liveable Housing Design Guidelines, with the remaining social homes built to Silver standard accessibility.
- 4.35 Deliver an ongoing program of activities and events to support community health and wellbeing and foster community cohesion, including pop-up activities and events at night and on weekends.

- 5.3 Provide affordable spaces for community use, local business, local creatives, entrepreneurs and start- ups.5.3 Work with service providers to explore opportunities to assist start-up businesses and locally based entrepreneurs to build their capacity in the local area.
- 5.4 Support tenants to maintain ties to education, learning and employment during and after relocations.
- 5.5 Ensure affordable Provide early education and care is available for all families and children.
- 5.6 <u>"Ensure school catchments enable all</u> residents to access high quality primary and secondary education close to home,"
- 5.7 Provide publicly accessible computers and digital access, as well as digital literacy and upskilling programs.

6 Feeling safe and welcome

- 6.1 <u>UseExplore the use of</u> community art on existing, temporary and new buildings and spaces to tell the stories of Waterloo and encourage community involvement and cultural expression.
- 6.2 Name <u>social housing</u> buildings and <u>/or</u> public spaces to reflect local stories and culture and develop them through community engagement.
- 6.3 Incorporate and interpret Explore opportunities to incorporate elements of existing buildings and spaces within the new buildings and spaces.
- 6.4 Ensure the design, programming and management of parks and community facilities encourage and enable equitable use by people of all ages, abilities, incomes and tenures and from all backgrounds.
- 6.5 Create a programmed mix of complementary uses in the community centre, parks and shops during the day and at night.
- 6.6 Use inclusive language, signage and symbols in facilities and spaces.
- 6.7 Maximise accessibility to <u>new</u> homes, services and <u>spacespaces</u> for people of all abilities, during and after construction.
- 6.8 "Use6.8 Support a sense of safety during construction by incorporating elements such as lighting, artwork on hoardings, community activities and other approaches to support a sense of safety during construction.".
- 6.9 Monitor and improve community safety through working with the community, safety action plans and addressing community perceptions and antisocial behaviour.

- 6.10 Incorporate crime prevention through environmental design, including lighting, activation and passive surveillance, into all aspects of the built environment.
- 6.10 Incorporate 6.11 Explore the provision of public toilets which are well maintained as part of the renewal of public spaces.
- 6.12 Aim to establish and open for community use.
- 6.11 "Establish, resource and remunerate a tenant group to help welcome new residents and introduce the Waterloo community.".
- 6.1213 Prepare and distribute a welcome pack to introduce new residents to the community.

7 Being green and clean

- 7.1 "Providing a large park next to Waterloo Metro station, as the focus of community activity and containing a wide range of uses for the community's diverse needs:".
- 7.2 Provide a smaller park next to the community centre for passive recreation.
- 7.3 Create rooftop gardens on buildings whereverwhere possible.
- 7.4 Retain existing trees whereverwhere possible throughout Waterloo South.
- 7.5 Design and build streets, pedestrian routes and parks to be shaded <u>where possible</u> and pleasant to use.
- 7.6 __Use high quality, and where possible, sustainable materials in all new housing-._
- 7.7———Design and build homes to be energy and water efficient.
- 7.8 __Design and build homes and community facilities to stay cool, with natural ventilation, and be economical to heat-__"
- 7.9 Ensure public and communal spaces, including parks, streets, gardens and green infrastructure, are well maintained.
- 7.10 Consider the diverse needs of tenants and residents, including older people, people with disability and the CALD community, when designing and delivering waste and recycling systems.
- 7.11 Provide <u>tenants with</u> sustainability education programs to support social, economic, cultural and environmental health.

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
