Maximise social and affordable housing

Demonstrate benefits of a CHP-led project Move our head office back to Redfern and link to community space Community outcomes - in design, employment and as residents

Excellent design that is tenure blind

What's the plan? Noting we are yet to finalise planning!

100 Apartments owned by NSW Land and Housing Corporation (managed by a community housing provider)

> 10 Specialist Disability + 1 Carer Apartment (Owned by investor and managed by Bridge Housing)

40 Apartments owned by Bridge Housing (Managed under NSW Affordable Housing Guidelines)

80 Key Worker Apartments (Owned by investor, managed by Bridge Housing, 20% discount to market rent, held minimum 10 years)

100 Apartments for Sale





3. Private Gardens and Balconies Green elevated spaces ensure privacy and surveillance




2. Welcoming Entries + CorridorsProtected outdoor entry foyerHigh amenity corridors

Block Design & Principles



- Elizabeth Street buildings most prominent frontage
- Tenure blind
- Greened facades to Elizabeth Street
- Multiple design voices
- Varied vertically proportioned facades
- Reflect the diverse nature of Redfern
- Responds to varied interfaces, context and Country
- More green space
- Balustrades to consider privacy
- Prefabrication where possible
- Modulated textures and rebates
- Activation and passive surveillance
- High quality materials
- Maximum of 30% glazing
- Shading appropriate to orientation


