








# Overview of social housing in Redfern & Waterloo




- 4,300 social housing households are located in the Sydney Metropolitan Development Authority operational area
- 3,500 of these in the concentrated social housing precincts in Redfern and Waterloo.
- Dwelling types includes terrace houses through to high-rise towers.





#### Planning Process




- Draft BEP2 Exhibited by SMDA
- Public consultation on Draft BEP2
- Consideration of submissions and issues raised
- Undertake background studies and community engagement to develop a concept plan by late 2011
- SMDA prepare Urban Renewal Study for public release in 2012
- Undertake more detailed work and community engagement to develop a preliminary masterplant | Family & Community Services | Housing NSW



#### **Master Planning Process**

- HNSW has commenced preparation of a Preliminary Master Plan with funding assistance from Commonwealth's Housing Affordability Fund
- The Preliminary Master Plan will provide the guiding framework for the future renewal of the area to provide a sustainable mix of private, social and affordable housing
- The Preliminary Master Plan focuses on the redevelopment of the two housing NSW major sites and the impact of the that redevelopment on Redfern and Waterloo







## The preliminary masterplan provides a framework to:

- Renew ageing and inappropriate social housing to provide a mix of suitable housing, with access to jobs and services
- Link the concentrated sites better into the overall neighbourhoods by improving the urban form and expanding the tenure mix
- Enhance the urban environment, integrating new buildings with existing high-rise towers, and create a quality public domain
- Utilise the expansive street network to provide safe pedestrian linkages, encouraging cycling and the use of public transport
- Provide for well-planned and appropriate community infrastructure and services
- Promote ESD focussing on energy efficiency, water conservation and waste recycling within the site







### **Community Consultation**

Preliminary master plan work is informed by previous and ongoing inputs, including:

- Input from existing community and stakeholder groups, service providers, Redwatch, NABs, Aboriginal groups, ethnic-specific groups etc
- Input provided through processes and direct community consultation, Places and Spaces for People Tours, Expert Forums, stakeholder interviews etc.
- Background research and project evaluations







### Community Engagement





Specific activities undertaken to date include:

- Expert Seminars and workshops
- Capacity building workshops, bus trips and curb-side gatherings
- Distribution of newsletters and an information booklet to all social housing residents
- Direct contact with over 800 people early this year about the renewal process
